



National Mortality Database

About

The National Mortality Database (NMD) holds records for deaths in Australia from 1964 to 2012. The database comprises information about causes of death and other characteristics of the person, such as sex, age at death, area of usual residence and Indigenous status.

Publishing/releasing your NMD analysis

If you wish to publish or release any analysis using the NMD that is not already publicly available, you need data custodian clearance. You also need to include some standard explanatory notes.

Please contact deaths@aihw.gov.au for more information, and CC this mailbox in data custodian clearance workflows.

- Question: Can I publish new results from the NMD or share my results with colleagues outside the AIHW? (1)
- Question: Can I publish results from the NMD based on 1 or 2 deaths? (1)
- Question: How far back do we have ICD-10 coded data? (1)
- Question: How far back do we have multiple cause of death data? (1)
- Question: I want to perform analysis based on Indigenous status and need assistance. (1)
- Question: What is the latest available year of data? (1)
- Question: Which variable should I use, year of registration of death or year of occurrence of death? (1)






Institute Projects 2014 wrap up: lots of trends about project briefs

Number and type of projects

- · 237 projects were approved in 2014-about 70 fewer than in 2013, but many of the projects approved in 2013 are likely to have been well underway before the transition to Institute Projects.
- Just over half (52%) had a publishing deliverable. The high number of nonpublication projects is a good sign, as it shows that we're not restricting the benefits of the system to a narrow subset of our work.







Completion rate






